COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES

The **comparative** form of an adjective is used for comparing two people, animals or things.

Short adjectives (1-2 syllables)	Long adjectives (2-3 syllables)
+er than	more than
old, new, narrow, warm, quick	 simple, quiet, friendly
 -e (late, nice, large)= +r (<i>later</i>) 	• beautiful, expensive, difficult
 -y (happy, tidy, ugly)= +ier 	
(happier, tidier)	EXAMPLE:
• CVC (big, wet, sad)= double	- The bunny is more beautiful than the
consonant (<i>bigger, wetter</i>)	ostrich.
	- The necklace is more expensive than
EXAMPLE:	the bracelet.
The cat is smaller than the horse.	

Exceptions

bad (dolent)	worse than
good (bo)	better than
Far (lluny)	farther than
little (of a quantity) (menys)	less than
much (més)	more than
