A Museum is a permanent institution in the service of society and of its development, open to the public, which acquires, conserves, researches, communicates and exhibits the tangible and intangible heritage of humanity and its environment, for the purposes of education, study, and enjoyment. Archaeology Museums specialize in the display of archaeological artifacts. Many are in the open air, such as the Agora of Athens and the Roman Forum. Others display artifacts found in archaeological sites inside buildings, exhibit maritime archaeological materials.

The National Archaeological Museum of Tarragona (MNAT), created in the mid-nineteenth century as a Provincial Museum, promotes the recovery, conservation, investigation and dissemination of heritage from the Roman city of Tarraco and its area of influence. To carry out its objectives, it organizes activities and offers various services such as temporary exhibitions, conference cycles, seminars, workshops and historical reconstruction activities, publishing of publications and the realization of audiovisual programs.

Tarragona is a city in southern Catalonia, its location on the Mediterranean shores of the Costa Daurada. Founded in the 3rd century BC with the name of Tarraco, the Romans made it the capital of the Tarraconense province, which is why it still conserves remarkable archaeological remains of this period.
