

# Welcome to my country!

## Description of the activity:

1. Students were asked in advance to prepare a photo of a place in their own country which they would like to present to other students. They also prepared a short oral presentation, answering the questions:
  - Where is the place?
  - Why is it interesting?
  - What can you do there?
2. During students spoke in turns, presenting their places. The moderator asked some additional questions to encourage students to speak.
3. At the end of the meeting the participants spoke in turns, saying which places they would like to visit and why.
