
UK Fashion victim!



Wear with care: The man lost his designer shirt - and his jeans

The hunt is on for a knife-wielding thief who forced his victim to strip before making off with the man's designer clothes.

The 29-year-old victim was left clad in his underpants and socks after the incident in Edinburgh during the early hours of Monday morning.



Lothian and Borders Police said the victim, from West Lothian, met the man who was later to rob him in a nightclub in Edinburgh's Lothian Road.

Both were walking to another club when the thief stopped close to West Register Street Lane, near the east end of Princes Street, the city's main thoroughfare.

The assailant then brandished a knife and demanded his companion's Ben Sherman shirt, Versace jeans and a pair of deck shoes - worth a total of £200.

Edinburgh: Fashion-conscious town

The unnamed victim made his way to nearby Frederick Street where he was given a pair of jogging trousers by the driver of a van which stopped to help. The incident was then reported to the police.

'Unusual crime'

The thief is described as 5ft 10ins tall, of medium build, 20-25 years old and wearing a red shirt or jacket and dark trousers.

A police spokesman said: "The attacker was clearly interested in the victim's designer clothing which was worth about £200."



"This is an unusual crime and we feel the culprit may talk about it. We would appeal to anyone who recognises the description or who hears about the incident to contact us."
