On 27th December 2013, Maria Leijerstam from Wales became the first person in the world to cycle to the South Pole. The snow, wind and freezing cold made it slow and difficult, but she completed her journey across Antarctica in 10 days, 14 hours and 56 minutes. Leijerstam has won a place in the Guinness World Records for this extraordinary journey.

Thirty-five-year-old Leijerstam planned the trip for two years and she called her adventure *The White Ice Cycle Expedition*. She predicted she needed 20 days to complete the 638-kilometre journey. During 2013, she was busy training, designing and testing equipment in Siberia, Norway and Iceland.

Leijerstam arrived at the starting point on the Ross Ice Shelf on 17th December. Her three-wheeled PolarCycle carried 45 kilograms of food and equipment and a pair of skis. She could use the skis instead of the front wheels when there was a lot of snow. The PolarCycle was designed and built for her by a company in Cornwall, England.

Using a GPS, Leijerstam cycled across the mountains on the Leverett Glacier. In some places there were winds of 160 kilometres an hour and the temperature went down to -29° Celsius. But she cycled for 10-16 hours a day and didn't stop. Maria Leijerstam has done other remarkable things and she'll continue to make history. Right now, she's planning her next expedition.
