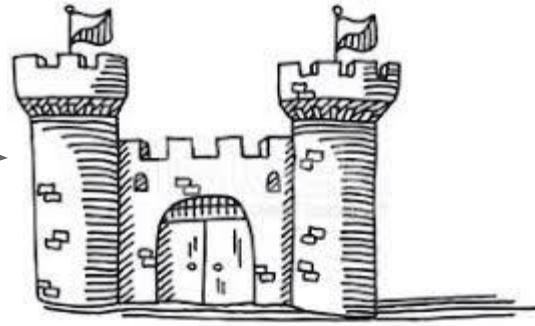

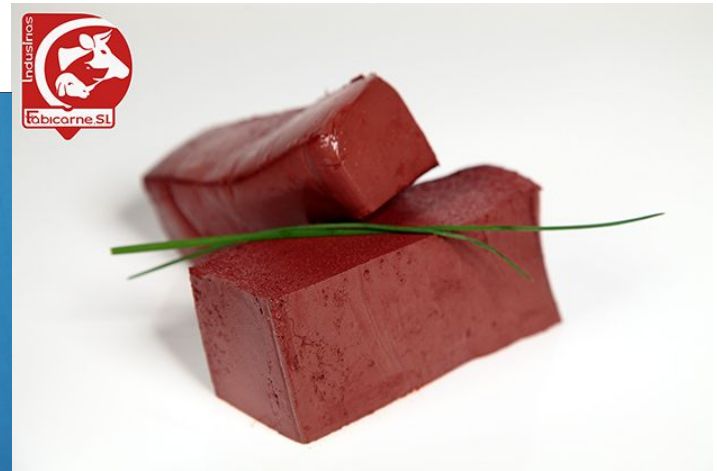
On 1st april people in britain trick their friends reporters also invent false news reports on the this day.

When Dickens was a 12 years old he lived in small room and worked long hours in a factory.

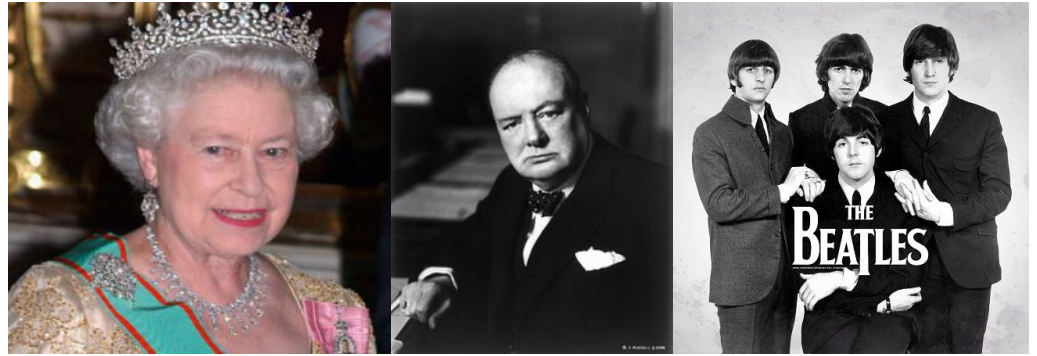
CHAPTER 9
