Skimmer possibly used in Lyons

The Lyons Police Department is investigating several cases of fraudulent debit/credit card purchases at fuel pumps, according to an LPD press release.

Police believe a device known as a skimmer was placed on a fuel pump card reader. The skimming device is used to capture the magnetic strip containing a customer's personal information, name and credit card number.

Police advised, when using credit or debt cards at fuel pumps, check to make sure the card reader is secure to the pump. If you find that the card reader is not secure please contact Lyons Police Department immediately. 620-257-2355

Accident south of Lyons leaves one dead

A late evening two-car accident three miles south of Lyons March 21 killed one passenger and left the driver with serious injuries when their vehicle was struck at Avenue Q and K14.

According to the Kansas Highway patrol, at 8:30 Hua Lin of Wichita was driving a Hyundai Palisade westbound on Avenue Q and failed to stop at a posted stop sign and collided with a Ford Focus driven northbound on K14 by Christy Morrison of Lyons .

Morrison's passenger, Christopher Morrison of Lyons, was transported to the Rice County Hospital where he was pronounced dead. Kristy Morrison was transported to St. Francis Hospital where she remains with serious injuries.

Neither Lin or the two passengers in the Palisade were injured in the crash.
